THE ABILITY TO MAKE SMALL TALK



- 1. Educate yourself on the local scene, including business, economics, politics, sports, arts, literature, and music.
- 2. Read and access global and local in-country news sources: both leading international and local publications, broadcast media, and social media.
- 3. Build an inventory of topics you can ask your hosts questions about to interact with them:
- 4. Ask questions about the specificities of your foreign counterpart's culture (e.g. local food, art, festivals Art, Festivals, History, ect)
- 5. Ask about their families, hobbies, and professions
- 6. Find out who are the top 2 or 3 popular local sports stars, singers, actors, entertainers, heroes (both current and historical)- they will be impressed by your knowledge and will be the occasion to start a conversation
- 7. Find common interests and start a conversation on them.
- 8. Other popular small talk topics are: Travels and holidays The latest movies, the weather People you both know (e.g. colleagues, etc).
